ISOTOCYANOZENE FOUND IN 'BENZO' CAPSULE

A CAPSULE FILLED WITH OFF-WHITE POWDER

that was expected to contain an unknown benzo was found to contain the novel nitazene isotocyanozene (5-cyano-isotodesnitazene). This is the second detection of isotocyanozene at a drug collection service in Australia, with the first being in late September 2025, also at CanTEST in Canberra.

There is no readily available data on isotocyanozene globally.

The potency of isotocyanozene is unknown, however nitazenes are known to be 100s or even 1000s of times more potent than heroin or morphine.

All nitazenes carry a risk of fatal overdose - even in very small amounts. Nitazenes are known to cause opioid-like overdose (lowered/loss of consciousness, breathing slowly or not at all, tiny/pinpoint pupils, discoloured lips/nails, cold or clammy skin, choking/coughing/gurgling or snoring sounds are all potential signs). Nitazenes can cause multiple overdoses over time.

Information on this substance is extremely limited. If considering using, please note that there is no evidence-based information on safer use strategies for isotocyanozene. Being informed, carrying naloxone, and staying with others can reduce potential harm.


